

Message from the

Chairman of the Board & Chief Executive Officer

2019 was a year of internal examination with an eye on re-focusing our attention on our mission to provide support province-wide to Albertans impacted by Parkinson disease and Parkinson's Plus Syndromes. Additional focus was given to ensuring talented Parkinson's researchers have the opportunity to focus their undertakings right here in Alberta.

While we were pleased with the revenue generated to support the aforementioned goals, the cost to do so was significant, finding us in a deficit at the end of the year. For the year ending December 31, 2019 Parkinson Association of Alberta is reporting a deficit of \$261,682, an increase over the previous year. And while donations, bequests and grants received by the organization **increased 24% to \$951,458**, it was insufficient to offset the increase in expenses seen in every category. (*Please see the financial summary on page 3 of this document.*)

We recognized the risk in allowing this to continue and made significant structural changes in order to minimize expenses while maintaining our ability to support Alberta's Parkinson's community. In late 2019, the organization saw a change in leadership with the departure of our former CEO. Further staffing and organizational changes continued into 2020 to ensure effective management of both operations and client services.

In terms of impact, 2019 saw an increase in the number of people served through a variety of supportive, educational and active program opportunities of 10% (9,239 people up from 8,409 in 2018). We ran 231 support groups that were attended by 3,944 people across Alberta. Our 2019 Hope Conference brought relevant and timely expertise on a number of topics relating to Parkinson disease. More than 100 participants enjoyed the education, comradery and sense of community that are so important for our clients and their families. The most significant and meaningful increase though, were the hours our team invested providing one-on-one and family support; 458 hours total which reflects a 110% increase over 2018.

With the arrival of COVID-19, Parkinson Association of Alberta, like most of the world, has had to adjust and re-imagine programming. This has given us the opportunity to think about what comes next for the organization and to learn from our experiences to continually improve our ability to connect with people across the province. We are grateful for the ongoing friendship and commitment of our clients, families, colleagues and stakeholders for standing with us as we work toward a more sustainable and impactful future for people living with and affected by Parkinson's in Alberta.




