Martin Kratz is a professor, author and retired senior technology and intellectual property lawyer.

Martin has written extensively in his field including his most recent text, "Canada's Intellectual Property Law", 3rd Ed. 2020 Thomson Reuters.

Martin was born in Alberta and did his university undergraduate and graduate work at the University of Alberta.

Martin is national co-director of Osgoode Hall Law School's Intellectual Property LLM program and teaches several courses in that program. He also teaches a cyber-security law master's level course at Concordia University of Edmonton.

Martin is current board chair of Parkinson Association of Alberta and has extensive board experience having served as chair, in a governance committee role and as a director on numerous boards.
